

Early Medieval Indian History: C. 500 CE – 1206 CE

Course Outcome:

1. Remember: Students will be able to recall and identify key events and developments in Early Medieval Indian History, including the rise of the Rajputs, Arab and Turkish conquests, and the evolution of political structures in the region.
2. Understand: Students will be able to comprehend the architectural and sculptural evidence from Early Medieval India, and analyze how these tangible artifacts reflect the cultural and social dynamics of the era.
3. Apply: Students will be able to apply their knowledge of the causes and consequences of early Turkish invasions in India, and evaluate the impact of these invasions on the political, social, and economic landscape of the region.
4. Analyze: Students will be able to analyze the economy of Early Medieval India, including trade and commerce patterns, the Agrahara system, and the status of different social groups such as untouchables and castes.
5. Evaluate: Students will be able to critically evaluate the growth of the Bhakti movement, the evolution of Buddhism and Jainism, and the proliferation of regional languages and literature during the Early Medieval period, and assess their significance in shaping Indian society and culture.

By the end of the course, students will develop a comprehensive understanding of Early Medieval Indian History, and be able to analyze and interpret the various aspects of this period using the different levels of Bloom's Taxonomy.
