1. Knowledge:

- Practice paraphrasing a variety of texts to maintain the original meaning and tone.
- Compose thoughtful and well-structured essays on literary topics, demonstrating critical thinking and analysis.
- Craft engaging and persuasive letters in response to different writing prompts.

4. Analysis:

- Analyze the poetic devices and techniques used in a variety of literary forms like lyric, sonnet, ode, elegy, etc.
- Compare and contrast the works of different authors in terms of style, themes, and literary techniques.

5. Synthesis:

- Develop original lyric poetry following a specific form or theme.
- Create a modern-day sonnet or ode inspired by the works of classical poets like Wordsworth and Shakespeare.
- Construct a dramatic monologue or ballad on a contemporary topic or issue.

6. Evaluation:

- Evaluate the effectiveness of different literary forms in conveying complex emotions or ideas.
- Judge the impact and significance of allegory and symbolism in poetry.
- Critically assess the use of blank verse and stanza in creating mood and atmosphere in a poem.
