- 1. Remembering: Students will be able to recall key themes, characters, settings, and plots from various short stories, novels, fairy tales, picaresque novels, gothic novels, and detective novels studied in class.
- 2. Understanding: Students will be able to explain the main ideas and concepts present in the different genres of literature studied, and analyze the relationships between characters and their actions.
- 3. Applying: Students will be able to apply literary techniques such as symbolism, imagery, and point of view to analyze and interpret the texts, and draw connections between the literature and the broader social and cultural contexts.
- 4. Analyzing: Students will be able to deconstruct the texts into their basic elements, including plot, setting, character development, and narrative structure, in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the author's storytelling techniques.
- 5. Evaluating: Students will be able to critique and evaluate the themes, messages, and literary techniques used in the texts, and form their own opinions on the value and significance of the literature they have studied.
- 6. Creating: Students will be able to demonstrate their understanding of the elements of fiction by creating their own short stories, novellas, or novel excerpts that incorporate key literary techniques and themes discussed in class.
