July 1st marks the birth and death anniversary of the most famous physician of India, Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, and is celebrated as Doctors' Day to honor the dedicated professionals who save lives and improve healthcare outcomes. Many of these professionals rely on microbiology to diagnose and treat infectious diseases. Microbiology plays a vital role in medicine, enabling doctors to understand the causes of infections and develop effective treatments, making it an indispensable tool in their noble profession.

On this Doctors' Day, July 1st, 2024, the Microbiologists' Society, India, in association with the Postgraduate and Research Department of Microbiology, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, organized a national webinar on "Safety from Infections: Living in a World of Microbes!" through the Google Meet platform. The lecture in this webinar was given by Dr. Simontini Patra Banerjee, MBBS, MD, Consultant, Clinical Microbiology, ESI PGIMSR & Hospital, Manicktala, Kolkata. The webinar started at 4 PM and concluded a little after 6 PM.

The session was chaired by Dr. Malini Basu, State Coordinator, MBSI-WB, and Head of the Department of Microbiology at Dhruba Chand Halder College. Dr. Basu delivered the welcome address, setting the stage for an engaging and informative discussion. Dr. A. M. Deshmukh, President of MBSI, expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to contribute to such an important webinar. Debjani Dutta, Head of the Department of the Postgraduate and Research Department of Microbiology, St. Xavier's College, extended gratitude on behalf of the organizing institution. Dr. Kirat Ganguly, MBSI State Coordinator, WB, marked his presence with his inspiring words. Dr. Sanjeev Patankar, Chairman of AYUSH, contributed to this webinar by expressing his views on living in a world full of microbes, which is immensely important.

The webinar attracted participation from approximately 50 to 60 students representing various colleges, demonstrating a keen interest in the subject matter discussed. Ms. Adrija Ghosh, a student from St.

Xavier's College, efficiently served as the Master of Ceremonies (MC) for the event, ensuring smooth flow and coordination throughout. She also introduced the resource person, Dr. Simontini Patra Banerjee.

In this session, Dr. Simontini Patra Banerjee delivered a lecture on the topic "Safety from Infections: Living in a World of Microbes!" and highlighted her points through a spectacular PowerPoint presentation. She explained about microbial infections in detail, including those caused by bacteria, fungi, viruses, and parasites. She specifically focused on infectious diseases, the sources of these infections, and their diagnosis and prevention methods. Many important terms in medical science related to microbiology, such as prebiotics, probiotics, septicaemia, and antimicrobial resistance (AMR), were also referred to and explained.

To spread awareness, she also explained Hospital Infection Control (HIC) and gave some instructions to the audience. After the presentation, an interactive session took place where many students and professors asked their queries, and Dr. Simontini Patra Banerjee gave insightful and detailed responses, clarifying their doubts and sharing her expertise in the field of microbiology, leaving the audience enlightened and appreciative of her knowledge and willingness to share it with others.

We received a good response from the audience, and they provided very positive feedback. The resource person thanked the organizers for arranging the live webinar. 





St. Xavier's College, Kolkata students visit Chinese borders under Centre's Operation Sadbhavana scheme.

St. Xavier's College, Kolkata recently sent a team of students and teachers to the remote borders along the line of actual control adjacent to China in Arunachal Pradesh as a part of a Central government project that aims to provide opportunity for students to experience the environment of bordering areas and to promote economic development of villages located in the borders, Father Dominic Savio, principal of the college said.

The six-day tour conducted last month included visits to several picturesque remote sites of historical significance. The team of 33 members including 30 students and three teachers started the journey from Sadalpur transit camp, the college said. After proceeding towards Char Dwar, the tour was officially flagged off at Tenga by the commanding officer of Artillery Battalion.

Some of the significant sites visited by the group are Jaswant Singh War Memorial at Twang, Surya Sambha War Memorial, Lhasa Dwar, the Holy Tree, a historical site from where Dalai lama first entered India. The group crossed the Sela Tunnel, a marvel of modern engineering and visited the Jung Waterfalls. The group stepped in the line of actual control where borders between India and China are without fencing and not demarcated with prominence and explored the 8th Century Padmasambhava Statue and the Gorsam Chorten Monastery.



The tour also covered visits to Bumla Pass, Subedar Joginder Singh war Memorial, Gurudwara Teesri Udassi at 16,000 feet, Sungster Lake and Tawang Monastery and Tawang War Memorial, the college said. The college, an autonomous institution run by the Jesuits, arranged the tour to comply with a policy of the Centre that aims to foster patriotism and nationalism among students and develop the economy of bordering 2966 villages of 19 districts in order to prevent the local people from leaving the villages for search of jobs. The policy also aims to promote movement of tourists to the region and combat Chinese invasion. As these villages are mostly controlled by the Indian Army, the government has taken an initiative to arrange border tours for college students and NCC cadets to Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Ladakh regions.

The tours are officially known as Seema Darshan tours under the project Operation Sadbhavana and the <u>University Grants Commission</u> asked universities and colleges to take advantage of the scheme last year, the college said.



Organised by the Indian Army, this tour offered a unique first of its kind opportunity to witness the grandeur of our nation's borders and pay tribute to our brave soldiers. Through this tour I believe that our students have developed a deeper understanding of national security, patriotism and sacrifices made by our armed forces. I am truly grateful to the Indian Army for making this possible for the students of our institution and becoming the first college in West Bengal to have embarked on this enlightening journey," Father Dominic Savio told Education World.

Student members of the delegation said that witnessing the border areas and the line of actual control, interacting with soldiers from both India and China and understanding the dynamic of peace and respect between them were thrilling.

"Being a Xaverian is a matter of pride and getting an opportunity to be a part of the delegation of students to the borders of our country. was truly inspiring and unforgettable for me," Mohammed Tauqueer Siddiqui, a final year student of management studies said.

Atish Prosad Mondal head of the department of accounting and finance said "It was indeed a great opportunity for me to lead the team. It was

enthralling to witness such sites and places which normal civilians can't witness in their lifetime with the help of the Indian army." BALL OF FIRE DIVISION



BIRTHDAY COMMEMORATION OF RESPECTED FATHER PRINCIPAL REV. DR. DOMINIC SAVIO, SJ



For the past 40 years, Bertram Da'Silva, professor of English at St. Xavier's College, Kolkata, has been quietly and unassumingly changing lives. He has been many things in these decades, among them — dean of arts when the college became autonomous in 2006, and then vice-principal for the past 14 years. Yet, for students in his classroom, he has always been someone who fundamentally shaped how they read and understood literature and art. For us, he is THE teacher, the one who made all the difference.

It was a muggy monsoon day in 1998 when Professor Da'Silva walked in to take his first class with my batch. There isn't a lot of space between the door and the dais in room 11 at St. Xavier's College, but he managed to cross it with quite a bit of swagger. He sat down and stared at us — cool, sharp eyes from under a shock of curly hair. He looked irritated by our presence and proceeded to tell someone that he didn't like his face. He then talked about poetry. I didn't understand much in that first class and he didn't condescend to dumb things down. He had enough respect for his students to never do that. The message was simple — keep up or give up.

For people expecting a John Keating like figure, Professor Bertram Da'Silva, or Bertie, as we knew him, was at the opposite end of that spectrum. He didn't ask you to tear your books but threw you out of class if you didn't have your text. If you stood on a bench in his class, he would probably ask you to jump out of the window. There was nothing whimsical, vague or precious about him. He didn't encourage students to be pally with him and, truth be told, we were (for the most part) scared witless of his scalpel-sharp put-downs. He was in the business of teaching, and because it was important to him, he made sure that it was important to us.

A classicist in construction, a Romantic in delivery

Professor Bertram Da'Silva has the unique ability to make any text interesting, even if he doesn't much like it himself. That's because it

was his job to give us an even-handed view of it, bring out its beauty in ways we could never have thought of. We would go to him gushing about a play or a poem that he had finished teaching and he would say, "Yeah, I don't think it's well-written at all." We would leave a little deflated, but there was an important lesson in there for us. He was doing his job whether he liked something or not.

With texts he did like, those classes changed the very wiring of our brains. And that's what has made him so special for generations of his students. He taught us to think, to develop a sight of our own. But that's not all.

I've never met anyone (in person or in recorded online lectures) who could make you see a text in the way he did. According to him, it's because he's a musician and he can hear the invisible patterns that come together to create harmony in a song. And literature is no different. That's probably why his classes sometimes felt like listening to a beautifully crafted song. Yet it was the way in which they were structured that made them brilliant. Each class was constructed meticulously, with all the patient skill of a master clockmaker, each little part playing its role in the larger structure.

Professor Bertram Da'Silva is a classicist in the construction of his classes — orderly, symmetrical, rational and logical. But he is a Romantic in his delivery, each class a well-rehearsed performance, which was at times clinically efficient, at times argumentative, and at the right time deeply passionate and profound. He led us on with absolute deductive clarity, making sure that we registered each stage until he would reveal the ending and everything would fall marvellously into place. It was that final moment we all looked forward to and loved. It was a lightbulb moment, an 'aha' moment, a wonderful, magical moment when the world for a while made sense.

He was both Houdini and Holmes, a man who took us on wild rides with an impresario's panache




When Professor Bertram Da'Silva taught literature, it mattered. It was as important as any other pursuit in the world. Once at the end of a particularly intense class on WB Yeats, as his lecture reached a crescendo of revelatory brilliance, he had said in a voice throbbing with muted excitement: "That's harmony! That's truth!" For us, his classes were just that. He was both Houdini and Holmes, a man who took us on wild rides with an impresario's panache.

In the four decades that he has taught at St. Xavier's College, students have loved him (sometimes in hilariously unhinged ways) for all kinds of reasons. Tales about Professor Bertram Da'Silva are legion and could fill up a good-sized book by now. But there's not much point in telling him about them. He doesn't like fuss, and his usual response to overt expressions of adoration is to gently steer them (or himself) away where he can't hear them. But there's a legacy that resides in his students all around the world for whom his classes shaped their minds and their lives. In his single-minded dedication to his profession and the craft, grace, integrity and honesty he brings to it, he belongs to a generation of teachers that is all but gone. For the rest of us who teach, whose fondest memories of learning are in his classroom, we know that there can never be another BD.

St. Xavier's College and Chowman join hands to create an accessible hospitality course. The six-month course will commence this November at the college's Raghabpur campus.

The course was launched by (L-R) St. Xavier's College Raghabpur Campus vice principal Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara; HRAEI president Sudesh Poddar; St. Xavier's College Principal Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ; Chowman managing director Debaditya Chaudhury; and vice principal of PG and Research Department of Commerce, Evening, Rev. Dr. Peter Arokiam.

For the longest time, hospitality education has been gate-kept by elite, English-speaking private institutes. St. Xavier's College and Chowman are looking to change this. The Jesuit institution and the popular Chinese food chain are joining hands to launch a Certificate Course on Hospitality Management. **My Kolkata** was there at the college's Park Street campus for the official briefing.

The six-month course will be launched at St. Xavier's College's Raghabpur Campus, with the aim to make an education in hospitality more accessible to people from low-income backgrounds.



'If this course is successful, we hope to launch it in the Park Street campus too,' said Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio

Debaditya Chaudhury, managing director of Chowman and coowner of Oudh 1590 and Chapter 2, expressed his enthusiasm at how the course would help underprivileged students find a footing in the industry. Speaking about how he conceptualised the course on a visit to the Raghabpur campus, Chaudhury said, "Students from non-urban spaces are often under-confident about their skills—because they don't come from English-speaking private schools. Irrespective of language or financial condition, everyone has the right to dream. When I discussed my desire to start an accessible hospitality course with Father Dominic Savio, he encouraged me to formulate it for the Raghabpur campus. As an alumnus of St. Xavier's, it was a great opportunity."

The result was an extensive six-month certification course, which will be open to people from all backgrounds. The course will have three months of theoretical learning and three months of practicals. During the course, students will receive internships in Chowman's various restaurants, where they will be trained in both kitchen and service skills, in keeping with the industry's highest standards. "Having restaurants around the country, including Bangalore, Hyderabad and Delhi, we are committed to providing the best Pan-India learnings to these students, and open to taking them to different cities too," added Chaudhury. Upon completion, students will also have the opportunity to be absorbed within the restaurant chain, with the choice of delving deeper into the kitchen, or service sections.



'We at Chowman have dreams of expanding rapidly. The only challenge we face is finding quality talent, which we hope this course will remedy,' said Debaditya Chaudhury

The first session of the course will begin on November 13, admitting 40 students, with an option to extend it to 60 in case of high demand. In order to keep the course accessible to students from financially challenged backgrounds, the fee for the entire six-month course is Rs 5,000. St. Xavier's College is also willing to provide concessions in case any student can't afford to pay. "No student who wants to study should have to miss out because of money," said Savio. In keeping with the focus on accessibility, the course is open to any individual who has passed Class XII, along with graduates from any stream.

Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, the vice principal of the Raghabpur campus, also expressed his thoughts at the commencement of this partnership, stating, "So many young students wish to enter the hospitality field, but cannot due to lack of training. This merger will open their careers to infinite possibilities."

Sudesh Poddar, the president of the Hotel & Restaurant Association of Eastern India and the joint secretary of the Federation of Hotel & Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAI), emphasised on the need for such courses — that would make aspiring hospitality students more employable. "Hospitality is one of the fastest-growing industries in the world, and it will generate huge employment. In order to meet this growing scale, we need quality employees, a requirement that I am sure this course will fulfil," he said, while adding that FHRAI would fund the education of 20 deserving students each year.

Event - Much Ado About Nothing



Awareness Programme- Eklavya School Bankura

On 1st December 2024, **2nd-Year B.Ed. and MA students of the Postgraduate Department of Education** of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata visited the Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS), Mukutmanipur, Bankura and 4 tribal villages as a part of Research Survey.

Established in 2002, the school falls under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India scheme to uplift the scheduled tribes across India. The students were able to interact with the non-teaching staff, local pupils, hostel matrons and Teacher in Charge through a series of interviews to better understand their challenges and experiences in the school.

Our students staged an environmental awareness programme followed by a creative poster making session on environmental conservation by the Eklavya school students.

An English medium school, EMRS currently has 437 enrolled students, almost 44% of which are girls. Interviews with the staff members and students revealed a significant shift in opinion towards girl child education with more families opting to educate their daughters. Students coming from extremely disadvantaged, rural backgrounds are able to structure their lives through academics and discipline that help them secure well-paying employment. The female

students especially have benefitted greatly from the school, conducting themselves with remarkable confidence and pride.

The visit served to be an enriching learning experience for our students who were able to engage firsthand with the unique challenges and grassroots reality of school teaching in diverse rural environments and gain critical insight into the resources, infrastructure and student needs that can improve the ways in which education can be used for holistic upliftment.
