**TITLE: Pathway to Innovation: Critical Thinking, Hands on Active Learning, and Cutting-Edge Research**

**Abstract:**  
Sustained flow of innovation is the key to the prosperity of any knowledge based economy. To create a steady pipeline of next-gen problem solvers and innovators we need to address three main challenges: 1) enhancement of critical thinking ability of students; 2) student engagement in relevant hands-on activities through active learning, and 3) student involvement in exciting modular frontline research projects. In this seminar Dr. Das will address these challenges and discuss pathways to create a pool of next generation STEM leaders and creative problem solvers. He will also discuss some of his latest curiosity driven research projects such as 1) plasma generation using a kitchen microwave, 2) solid body rotation dynamics in zero gravity, 3) laser scribed graphene nano-inductors etc.

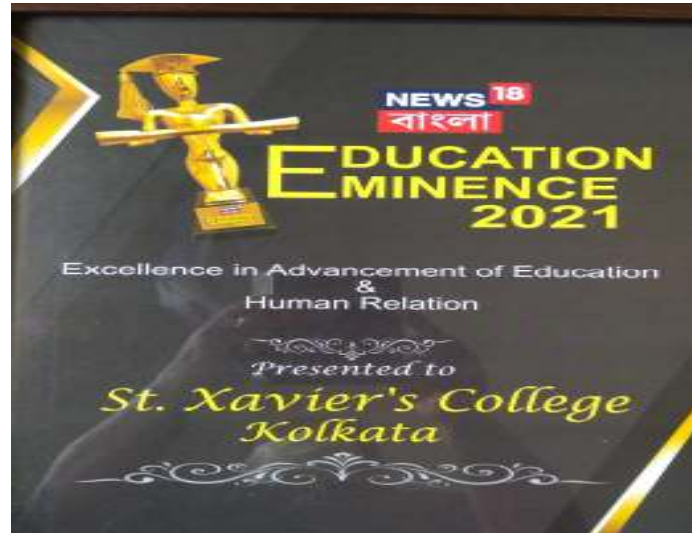

**Role of Youth as Peacemakers**

A week-long **Tree Plantation and Sapling Distribution** Initiative of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata and St. Xavier's College (Calcutta) Alumni Association was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, Principal St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata and President SXCCAA in presence of Rev. Fr. Dr. Thamacin Arulappan, SJ, Principal St. Xavier's Collegiate School and President ALSOC along with other Jesuit Fathers and Brothers of St. Xavier's Community, Members of SXCCAA and ALSOC, on 08th August 2021 afternoon at Raghobpur Campus of St. Xavier's College. Some 100 saplings were planted at the grounds of the Campus and 500 more saplings were distributed by Rev. Father and others in this Inaugural initiative. This initiative featured more of such Plantation drives across the state of West Bengal in the next 7days in the surrounding Amphan and Yaas affected villages, ending on the auspicious occasion of 75th Indian Independence Day on 15th August at Park Street campus. While inaugurating the initiative, Rev. Fr. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ mentioned that the plantation initiative was organized as part of our obligation to Mother Nature, to give back something in return to the abundance that we enjoy. In this drive, we are focusing on tree plantation and sapling distribution at the villages which were affected by both Amphan and Yaas Cyclones namely Raghobpur, Panakua, Kulerdari, Paikhala, Keoradanga, Amgachhia, Bonhoogly and Bishnupur where more than 5000 trees were uprooted by the cyclones. Also in this COVID pandemic where lives are lost in absence of adequate oxygen supply, we aim to bring back the damaged ecosystem through this initiative. Notably today's Plantation drive was launched in commemoration of Death Anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore and at the greater interest of increasing the source of natural oxygen supply at the environment - which has been the major source of lifeline of people.

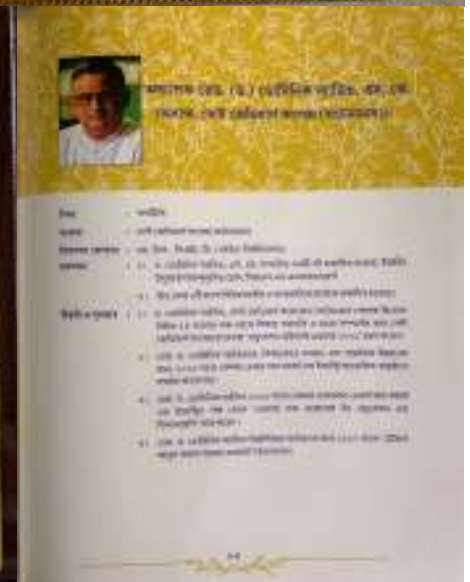

#### **Networking and liaising:**

- i. **Meeting with Fr. Johnson Padiyara, Vice Principal – RGP** – On 29<sup>th</sup> October, Ma'am Cheryl Francis had a meeting with Fr. Vice Principal regarding children's day and Christmas celebrations. Father assured to help in mobilizing the children from Raghampur village through the Pradhan or Panchayat members. During the meeting it was also decided that in the second week of November, an in-depth orientation will be conducted for first year students of the Raghampur campus about social outreach and compulsory social credits.
- ii. **Networking with UBA adopted villages:** From 25<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> October, the department staff made contacts with all the 5 adopted villages over phone to take stock of the flood situation and whether activities could resume. It was reported that Shalpur village was still affected and that we should wait till December/January to resume. Bakeswar Magurkhali, Debipur and Raghampur were willing to resume from November.
- iii. **Meeting with village contact persons of Magurkhali and Debipur villages** – On 29<sup>th</sup> October, Ma'am Cheryl Francis met the contact persons of Magurkhali and Debipur villages. In both the meetings, the village contact persons assured to mobilize around 25 children per village for children's day and Christmas program respectively. Ma'am Cheryl Francis also briefly discussed about the flood situation in these villages.

**National Service Scheme – Unit I & II**

**I. Departmental meetings:**

Around 10 department meetings were held this month to discuss about various upcoming events such as celebrating children's day, observing World AIDS Day and celebrating the joy of Christmas through 'Let's Care and Share'.

**II. Academic Audit:**

On 12<sup>th</sup> November, Ma'am Cheryl Francis along with Prof. Ayon Chandra, Secretary, Academic Council, attended the meeting of the Academic Audit team at the Raghbapur campus. On 13<sup>th</sup> November, the Audit team visited the NSS office in the main campus wherein Ma'am Cheryl Francis gave a brief overview of the department's activities and future plans. The team appreciated the meaningful outreach work that the department was engaged in and encouraged the staff members to continue the good work.

**III. Children for Environment:**

The ongoing pandemic impacted almost everyone. However, it was the Children who were the hardest hit. With schools closed for over 18 months and children cooped up at home with no scope of meaningful engagement, this year's Children's Day had to be a time of joy for them. Keeping in mind the COVID-19 protocols, the department organized a **Sit and Draw Competition** with the theme '**Children for Environment**' on **14th November 2021** for a limited number of children from classes V to X from three adjoining villages of Bakeswar, Magurkhali and Raghbapur. These children were mobilised through the SHG groups with whom the department closely works. They were happy and felt involved. They took the responsibility of bringing the children and taking them back to their respective homes.

On 14th November 2021, the usually quiet Raghbapur campus became alive with the incessant laughter and chatter of about 65 children. Around 8 volunteers from Raghbapur campus (5 pass out students and 3 semester V students) were present too. The children were divided into three groups according to their classes and given topics for the competition. The three topics were: (i) Group 1 (Classes V and VI) – **Our Environment**; (ii) Group 2 (Classes VII and VIII) - **Life under water**; and (iii) Group 3 (Classes IX and X) - **Save Environment**. All the children were provided a drawing kit for the competition.

Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, S.J.'s (Vice-Principal of Raghbapur campus) in his message for the children encouraged the children to be obedient to elders, enjoy playtime with friends and continue with their education. Father, assured the children that soon they could come more frequently to the campus for a time of learning and joyful engagement with the students of the College. He further thanked the department staff for their committed work. Ma'am Cheryl Francis briefly explained to the children about the Sit and Draw competition that was organized for the children and thanked the five SHG members (from the aforementioned villages) for their hard work and support in mobilising the children.

Before the close of the programme, Rohit Makal, a class V student of Bakeswar village shared, "*Amar drawing korte khub bhalo lage, aaj St. Xavier's College e esche ami je ei drawing competition e bhag niteparechi tar jonno ami khub khushi. Ami aro asteh chai college eh aar dada didi der sathe alaap korte chai*" (I love to draw, I am very happy to come to St Xavier's College today and participate in this drawing competition. I want to come to College more often and spend time with dadas and didis). On the other hand, Neha Rong a class X student from Magurkhali village shared, "*Aaj drawing korte korte, ami aro swachetan holam je amader protek er daietto ache amader poribesh rokha korar*". (While drawing I became aware that we all have a responsibility to safeguard our environment). The programme came to a close with a promise that all will meet soon in the campus with more such activities for the children. Besides the drawing kit, the children also got two food packets before they left the campus.

It was an emotional day for the staff, as they met the children after a long period of time. The smiles on their faces and the ray of hope in their eyes to get back to school motivated the staff to further organise such events for small groups of children in the coming months.

	<p><b>I. Coordination and networking meetings:</b></p> <p>i. <b>Meeting with Vice Principal of Raghampur campus:</b> The department staff had meetings with Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, S.J. on 8<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> November to discuss about children’s day and Christmas celebrations. With the guidance and help from Father Vice Principal, the staff were able to mobilize children from Raghampur village. The department was also able to establish contact with SHG members of Raghampur village.</p> <p>ii. <b>Meeting with SHG members of Bakeswar and Magurkhali:</b> On 8<sup>th</sup> November, a meeting was held with the village contact persons of Bakeswar and Magurkhali villages to follow-up about mobilization of participants for children’s day programme. Besides this in-person meeting, around five telephonic follow-up meetings were held which ensured the presence of children for the programme.</p> <p>iii. <b>Meeting with SHG members of Debipur village:</b> On 8<sup>th</sup> November, Ma’am Cheryl Francis visited Debipur and had a detailed discussion with the village contact person regarding mobilisation of children for ‘<b>Let’s Care and Share</b>’ programme. Ms. Uma Majhi, the village contact person assured full cooperation for the said programme. On 29<sup>th</sup> November, a focused group discussion was held with about 10 SHG members to understand the needs of the SHG groups. The members shared that the government has initiated various training programmes for the SHG members and also provided various handholding support. During the meeting, Ma’am Cheryl Francis suggested that the department would provide capacity development trainings for the members from next year which was welcomed by the women. She also suggested that the SHG members would coordinate with the department to resume Village Education Programme (VEP) in the village. This suggestion was welcomed and appreciated by the women. Ma’am Sucheta Mukherjee, shared about the department’s plan to conduct an analytical study on prevailing learning gap among the children of various classes due to the pandemic. The women welcomed this idea of the department and agreed to extend their cooperation for the same.</p> <p>iv. <b>Meeting with SHG members of Raghampur village:</b> A meeting was held with about 10 members of three Self Help Groups from Raghampur village on 24<sup>th</sup> November. The main objective was to give the SHG members a brief overview of our outreach work and establish rapport with them to take forward various rural development programmes in the village. Ma’am Cheryl Francis explained to the women that the department aims to build the capacity of all the SHG members in an effort to strengthen the groups. She further explained that when situation normalizes the College would initiate Village Education Programme (VEP) in the village. The children would be mobilized through the SHG members for the VEP. Towards the end of the meeting, the women were encouraged to share their thoughts. They shared that most of them were not aware of the various functions of the SHG members. They also expressed their willingness to undergo capacity building and livelihood generation trainings. It was decided that in January, the women will invite the department staff to address all the members of their respective groups. Departmental meetings:</b>  Around 2 department meetings were held this month to discuss about upcoming event of Let's Care and Share- Celebrating the joy of Christmas.</p> <p><b>II. Observing World AIDS Day 2021 – Let's be more responsible!</b>  The ongoing pandemic, which fuelled disparity and disregard for human rights, allowed HIV to remain a global crisis affecting millions of people worldwide. The global community made considerable progress in the recent past, however, in 2020, according to World Health Organization, about 1,500,000 people were newly infected by HIV/AIDS worldwide. Therefore, on the occasion of World AIDS Day, the department organized an awareness session for semester V students of Raghampur campus on 1st December 2021. The number was restricted to about 40 students and all COVID-19 protocols were followed.</p> <p>To set the tone and prepare the students about the topic, the session was divided into two parts. In the first part, the department staff held group discussions with the participants on – (i) understanding and realizing the importance of taking informed decisions; (ii) being aware about health hazards such as HIV; (iii) pledge to disseminate awareness among family and peers. The students were divided into two group for this discussion. Ms. Cheryl Francis interacted with the boys while Ms. Sucheta Mukherjee interacted with the girl students. By the end of the session, the students had a clear idea about their responsibility to raise awareness and to be alert always. As Atoshree Purkait, of Bengali department shared, <i>“From this interaction I realized how small steps such as ensuring the use of new syringe and destroying the same after use can go a long way in preventing the spread of HIV. It is my duty to always take informed decisions and encourage my friends to do the same. From this discussion I have also learnt that my decisions and actions will have ripple effect on my family as well, hence I must always act responsibly.”</i></p> <p>The guest speaker, Dr. Rumeli Das, Assistant Director of Child In Need Institute (CINI), who has been working on HIV for the past two decades, started the second part of the session with a quiz to understand the level of awareness among the students. During her session, she focused on the following aspects: (i) overview about HIV/AIDS and statistics related to the same; (ii) identification and protection of vulnerable groups; (iii) ways of HIV transmission; (iv) preventive measures; (v) process of testing; (vi) treatment and care; (vii) stigma associated with the disease.</p> <p>The students were then divided into smaller groups wherein each group had a real life case study to reflect upon. The students brainstormed and came up with apt course of action for each case study. At the end of the session, the students also got an opportunity to clear their doubts. The students submitted a feedback through which it was clear that the students had an increased level of awareness. As Rudrarup Sarkar, a commerce student rightly said, <i>“Before attending the session, I had a vague idea about HIV, now I have a lot more clarity. Also I have learnt how HIV patients are stigmatized, I will try my best and share this learning with my friends, so that we youth can stop such discrimination.”</i></p> <p><b>III. Let's Care and Share – Celebrating the joy of Christmas</b>  The NSS reached out to the children of Bakeswar, Debipur, Magurkhali, Nurshikdarchowk, Raghampur and Shalpokur villages with the joy of Christmas this month. Keeping the pandemic situation in mind and maintaining COVID-19 protocols, the department reached out to the children in two phases. During the first phase, on 12<sup>th</sup> December, around 200 children in the age group of 14 to 17 years were invited to Raghampur campus. The second phase was held on 15<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> December in Nurshikdarchowk, Debipur and Shalpokur villages respectively wherein another 200 children of the age group of 9 to 13 years participated.</p> <p>On 12<sup>th</sup> December, Raghampur campus resounded with the cheerful laughter of the children as they enjoyed themselves during the programme. The programme commenced with dances wherein children from Bakeswar, Debipur and Shalpokur villages performed. This was followed by a magic show and a talking doll show organized by the College Alumni</p>
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Association. The children were pleasantly surprised when they saw an 8-year-old performing magic for them. Magic Queen Mimi stole the show with her dexterous magic performances and kept the audience rapt in awe. The talking doll show had the children roll in laughter and requested the performer, Mr. Pintu, for more.

Our principal, Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, S.J. graced the occasion as the Chief Guest and was accompanied by Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, S.J. Vice Principal of Raghobpur campus, Rev. Fr. Joseph Kulandai, S.J. Vice Principal of Commerce morning, Rev. Fr. Peter Arockiam, S.J. Vice Principal of Commerce evening, and Brother Chintamani, Infirmary-in-charge. The former and present secretaries of the Alumni Association were present too for this programme. It was indeed a pleasure for the department to commemorate 25 years of Father Principal's priesthood and dedicate the programme in his honour.

Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, S.J. on behalf of the college welcomed the children and congratulated Father Principal on his 25 years of priesthood. On behalf of all the villages, Mrs. Nilima Dolui from Shalpur village and Mrs. Uma Majhi from Debipur village felicitated Fr. Principal on his silver jubilee of priesthood. Ma'am Cheryl Francis felicitated Father Principal on behalf of the department. Father Principal was overwhelmed by this gesture and shared, *"My journey of priesthood was made meaningful by the love and support of all of you and the communities around us, and above all by the grace of the Almighty."* Father Principal then continued, *"Christmas means bringing God in our hearts. Let's celebrate Christmas together by sharing love and kindness with everyone"*. He further encouraged the children to study hard and take admission in St. Xavier's College for their higher education. He added, *"Never worry about where the money will come from for you to study in this college, all you need to do is, study hard and rest the Fathers here will take care"*.

Rev. Fr. Johnson Padiyara, S.J. on behalf of the college and all the villages, thanked Ma'am Cheryl Francis for her dedication, hard work, commitment and unparalleled leadership in taking forward the outreach work of the college to the marginalized sections of the society. Towards the end of the programme, all the village contact persons and some SHG members from the six villages were acknowledged for their hard work and cooperation. As a token of gratitude, on behalf of the college, Fr. Principal handed over some gifts to the women.


Ma'am Cheryl Francis, thanked all present and all who worked tirelessly to make the programme meaningful for the children. She especially thanked the St. Xavier's College (Calcutta) Alumni Association for supporting this initiative. The children headed home gleefully with a gift bag and a food packet with the hope of pursuing their higher education in the college. This was rightly pointed out by Sushmita Patra, a class IX student from Debipur village, as she shared, *"Amar ekhane eshe khub bhalo lagche, ami Father er kotha moton, khub bhalo kore pora kore, ei College ei porbo."* (I am very happy to have participated in this programme. I will follow Father's advice and study hard so that I can study in this College later).

The second phase saw participation of around 200 children from the three villages of Debipur, Shalpur and Nurshidarchowk, who were encouraged to spread love, kindness and joy among each other. The children expressed their keenness to meet their 'dada's' and 'didi's' who helped them in their school curriculum during Village Education Programme. The SHG members and village contact persons assured full cooperation to the college for all forthcoming programmes. They also appreciated the efforts of the college in reaching out to the marginalized with education.

This year we were able to reach out to almost 400 children to Share & Care and let them know that they were the extended family of St. Xavier's College and that we look forward to seeing them in college one day.

In all the five adopted villages, the department, under NSS conducted 'Let's Care and Share – Celebrating the joy of Christmas' – an annual programmes. <p>January 2022</p>	<p><b>Department of Social Work: NSS &amp; UBA</b> <b>‘YOUTH – THE GAME CHANGERS’</b> National Youth Day 2022</p> <p>12<sup>th</sup> January is the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda and is celebrated as National Youth Day. On this occasion the National Service Scheme (NSS) organized a virtual interactive session on MS Teams platform for the students to enlighten them on the life of Swamiji and his ideals which has been adopted by NSS nationally. About 230 students across departments participated in this session.</p> <p>The theme for this session was <b>‘Youth – The Game Changers’</b>. Ms. Cheryl Francis introduced the theme to the students and its relevance to the occasion. She explained how Swamiji, a youth icon, depended on the energy and determination that every youth possessed. She cited some incidents from his life which exemplified his simplicity and high ideals. She added as to how by the lectures and speeches of Swami Vivekananda, many youths were inspired to ideas of <b>social-service</b> and <b>character-building</b>.</p>

	<p>Ma'am Cheryl stressed on Swami Vivekananda's message which he sent from Osaka (Japan) to the youth of the country — "<b>Let's be Human</b>". She emphasized on the fact that he wanted the youth to train themselves in order to serve humanity. What he wanted from the youth were '<b>muscles of iron</b>' and '<b>nerves of steel</b>'.</p> <p>Ma'am Cheryl concluded by motivating the students to become Game Changers – in their own families, in their neighbourhood, and wherever possible. She cited examples of how in the present context with the pandemic on one hand and with fake news, hate mongering and so on, how the Youth who have the power of the digital world, can become Game Changers and challenge the negative vibes and make our country more peace loving, progressive, and where every human being will be able to live with respect and dignity.</p> <p>To break the monotony of talk, the students were then given a quiz on Swami Vivekananda which they had to complete within 15 minutes. The next session conducted by Ms. Sucheta Mukherjee, cited examples of how young people as young as 4 years old, were making a difference in the lives of people. The 4-year-old donated her piggy bank savings for a migrant worker in Gujarat. On the other hand, a 17-year-old Aryan Gulati from Delhi, developed web-based application <i>LungAI</i> which helped in detecting the Covid-19 virus as well as 16 other lung disorders in just three to five seconds. For this innovation, Aryan won the <i>Atmanirbhar Bharat Ideathon</i>. Many more such examples were shared with the students ranging from how a radio jockey through her programme raised awareness on Covid-19 vaccination which resulted in the inoculation of a whole village, to a young boy in Tamil Nadu raising awareness about rising fake news and its negative impact. Ma'am Sucheta further shared about various NGOs in the country that were led by the youth and for the youth and encouraged students to volunteer in such organizations which are committed to bringing sustainable development.</p> <p>The students were given some time to interact, ask questions or even express their views and opinions. It was encouraging to hear how some students helped in their own capacity during the pandemic. Someone said how she was trying to break certain stereotypes in her younger brother. She believed that change begins from within.</p> <p>In conclusion the students were given a feedback form to be filled and sent within two hours. The intent of this session was to reverberate the message of Swami Vivekananda to every Youth of this nation and motivate the students to become women and men for others. Ma'am Cheryl thanked Dr. Madhu Agnihotri for helping with all technical support and thanked the students for being an interactive audience.</p>

	<p>women’s day programme to be held in March. Besides this, the staff mobilized women from Bakeswar and Nurshikdarchowk villages through telephone calls. A need assessment was conducted to understand the kind of training the women were interested in taking up. Most women did not want to take up pisciculture training. Instead, they wanted to undergo training which they would be able to take up, considering their household responsibilities, like sewing, sanitary making etc. The younger ones were interested in beautician course. The women were told that it would take some more time to set up a training unit at the rural campus. Meanwhile, capacity building and awareness sessions would be conducted for these SHG groups. Capacity building sessions would include training on how to schedule a meeting, preparing Agenda, writing minutes, taking attendance of all members, maintaining account book and the like. Awareness sessions would include legal aid awareness, awareness on government schemes for women etc.</p> <p>5. <b>Interactive session on ‘Dignity of Life: From Womb to Tomb’:</b> A virtual awareness session on “Dignity of Life – from Womb to Tomb” was conducted for the semester VI students from 14<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> February 2022, the objective being, to create awareness among the youth that Life in all its form has dignity and that the youth have a major role to play to ensure that dignity of Life. 1053 students participated in the sessions. To set the tone for the session, a quiz questionnaire was shared with the participants, who realized that there was need for them to increase their knowledge on current social issues.</p> <p>The session began with a PPT presentation which depicted various from of life that was devoid of dignity. The participants were shown pictures, some disturbing, and were asked to comment on each picture. The pictures ranged from life in the womb and how life, especially during this pandemic was lost and how those who died could not have a dignified burial or cremation. Some pictures also showed children working in brick kilns, manual scavengers, domestic workers, mentally challenged kept chained and the like. The participants were asked to point out pictures that caught their attention and a small discussion followed. The presentation concluded by asking young people to stand for Peace and Dignity of life, something that our world is in need of.</p> <p>Following this was a presentation by the XTS members. They made a video on how young people could play a role in saving somebody’s life and dignity. It began with a song and then a voice play depicting various stages of life and how the ‘doing good’ chain which was begun by an individual was continued by others. The session concluded with a feedback form once again circulated to the participants. It was observed that the participants enjoyed the session and as some said, “It was indeed an eye opener”.</p> <p>6. <b>Meeting with Vice Principal of Raghampur campus:</b> On 22<sup>nd</sup> February Ma’am Cheryl Francis and Ma’am Sucheta Mukherjee had a meeting with Rev. International Women's Day was celebrated on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2022, for the women of six villages in South 24 Parganas, adopted by St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, at the Raghampur campus. More than 150 women, who belong to the various SHGs under NRLM, joined the celebration, the theme being **"Ei Akashe Aamar Mukti"**

The Chief Guest for the programme was Mrs. Leena Gangopadhyay, Chairperson of the West Bengal Commission for Women. The Principal of the College, Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, in his keynote address, mentioned the efforts and initiatives undertaken by the College NSS to uphold the dignity of women, especially in the rural community.
