Hands-On Astronomy at F.E.L.O

The Postgraduate and Research Department of Physics in association with the Xaverian Astronomical Society of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Kolkata, held a summer workshop," **Hands-On Astronomy at F.E.L.O**". This Astronomy and Cosmology workshop was a two-day event organized for the students of classes 11 and 12 of St. Xavier's Collegiate School to provide them with a comprehensive understanding of basic Astronomy concepts, Cosmology theories and also to provide them with engaging hands-on activities on these topics. The workshop was held on 7th and 8th July 2023. The workshop aimed to promote interest in scientific research and space exploration by equipping the students with knowledge and insights in these fields.

The first day of this workshop started with the inaugural ceremony, in Room No.15 at 1 p.m. Reverend Fr. Principal Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, delivered the inaugural address. Vice- Principal, Professor Bertram da Silva, the former Dean of Science, Dr. Tapati Dutta, Dean of Science, Dr. Indranath Chaudhuri, Dean of Arts, Dr. Farhat Bano, along with the Head of the Department of Physics, Dr. Shibaji Banerjee were among the other dignitaries who embraced the occasion. The students were enthralled by the talk. The talk was followed by a sumptuous lunch break after which Dr. Shibaji Banerjee, delivered an equally engrossing and fascinating talk on Cosmology. The students were yet again beguiled by the expansiveness and the subtleties of the universe. To make the learning process more dynamic, the lecture was followed by the long-awaited Hands-On Session at the Father Eugene Lafont Observatory. The gloomy, cloudy weather dampened the moods of the students as they could not observe anything but understanding the workings of the instruments and handling the telescope and various other instruments, surely cheered them up and ended the first day on a rather sweet note.

The second day of the workshop, held in online mode due to the impending Panchayat elections in our state, the platform being Google Meet, began at 12 noon. It began with two extremely interesting Astronomy sessions conducted by the ex- and current students of the Department of Physics, where the participants were handed out subtle questions and relevant numericals which they had to solve during the interactive sessions. A similar pattern was adopted in the engaging and riveting Cosmology session which was also conducted by a team of ex and current students of the Department.


The two-day summer workshop came to an end with a feedback form rolled out to be filled by the students to help us grow in a forward

INSTALLATION OF BAM 1022 (Beta Attenuation Mass Monitor) AT ST. XAVIER'S COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), KOLKATA.

The BAM 1022, Real-Time Portable Beta Attenuation Mass Monitor was installed at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Raghabpur Campus on 17th July 2023 under the Sensor-based Air Measurement Observatory over South Asia (SAMOSA) project.

The research project titled "Sensor Based Air Measurement Observatory for South Asia (SAMOSA)" is a joint venture of institutions, namely IIT-D, UCB, and the Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW), New Delhi. The project SAMOSA is a collaborative effort of Prof Sagnik Dey & Dr. Sofiya Rao from Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IIT-D) and Prof. Joshua S. Apte & Dr Saumya Singh from the University of California, Berkeley (UCB).

The SAMOSA project was envisioned to map the extent of urban air sheds in the Indo-Gangetic Plain and assess the urban-rural gradient in air pollution levels in this region. To meet this objective, a network design that entails deploying sensors in not just cities but also nearby towns and villages has been developed. Further, within each


city/town/village, this network design captures the entire possible range of land uses to assess how pollution levels vary with different land use categories.

Under SAMOSA, 5-6 BAMs are planned to be deployed across India; the purpose is to see the relationship between urban and regional air quality in the context of the IGP air shed. In this project the focus is to set up a BAM network in the rural area. As of now, BAMs have been deployed in Hamirpur, Bangalore, IIT Delhi, Mai Village and Raghabpur.

BAM measures the mass concentration of ambient particulate matter collected onto filter tape with a time resolution of one minute. The BAM 1022 employs an in-line sampling geometry in which the attenuation of beta rays across filter media is measured, and particulate matter is sampled simultaneously. The deployment of BAM in Raghabpur Campus will help to get real-time data on the PM and meteorological parameters in the rural region of West Bengal and compare the air quality data with the urban regions. This will further help to understand the level of pollutants and their impact on the environment and human health. The BAM 1022 is ideal for criteria-grade air quality surveillance networks, near-roadside particulate matter monitoring and research and development.









Students of St. Xavier's conducted an initial passenger satisfaction survey for Kolkata Customs on 22.7.23. This is a consultancy cell activity being done by members of Xavier's consulting club. They understood how the Customs department operates. This initial survey will continue for 2 more days.



Ghoramara Island Report

Students of St. Xavier's College (Antonomeus). Kalkata, under the guidance and support of Bev. Dr. Dominia: Savio, SJ. Principal of St. Xavier's College (Autonomeus). Kolkata and dealership of Dr. Arup Kumar Mitra. Pounder Head of the Microbiology Department and Professor in Charge. EDC & Enactor SXC visited the Ghormann Island on Stel July, 2023. This visit was a part of an ongoing affort to uplift the residents of the sinking island, along with providing them the assistance necessary to surtain their means of livelihand. The team consisted of six students and those fourly members, along with Mr. Cristina Despension, a professor from New York University. The objective of the visit was to assess the souditions of the island and to conduct a movey titlad "Who's Staying and Who's



Going" to understand the hatching faced by the residents and gate insights into the erations behind their decisions to either stay or leave the island. Additionally, the turns aimed to distribute old clothes to the residents who were facing secretly of resonance.

Survey and Interviews

The team conducted interviews with the inhabitants of Obormous Island to collect first-hand information about their bring conditions, challenges, and finine plans. Ma-Crimia Deagoner led the interviews, while the other team members mainted in data collection and noise taking. The local group practicages

chief also provided valuable insights into the island's situation and shared information about the impacts of climate cluster on the island's community.

Findings

- I. Removes for Staying: The residents who chose to stey on the island sited various monons. The resident entration reason was the lack of foods to emigrate to the mainland. Many of the infraders, despite facing monomus challenges, expressed a strong attachment to their notherland and cultural bestege, which motivated them to remain so the island. However, they combinated the need for external support to improve their firing conditions and access to basic amendate.
- 2. Reasons for Leaving: Some residents opted to leave Oborsaman Jaland in search of better opportunities. Many had purchased land on the mainland and believed that migrating would provide them with improved livelihood prospects. The lock of autremable employment opportunities on the inhalf was a significant factor driving their decision to seek a better life clocwhere.



3. Climate Change Impact: The chief of the grain puncheyat highlighted the adverse effects of climate change on Gheenmars Island. Riving sea levels, erosion, and extreme climatic conditions were posing serious threats to the island's existence. He emphasised the argent need for aid and support from external sources to address the challenges faced by the community.



Distribution of Old Clothes:

As part of the visit, the team distributed old clothes collected in the city of Kolkata to the residents of Ghoramara Island. The clothes were well-received and appreciated by the inhabitants who were facing resource scarcity.

Future Plans:

The imights gathered during the visit underscored the pressing need for mutainable development initiatives on

Ghorumana Island. The team from St. Xavier's Collegiate School, plans to assess potential projects that can uplift the island's community. These projects could include interventions related to employment generation, access to healthcare facilities, and measures to mitigate the impact of climate change.

Conclusion:

The visit to Ghoraman Island provided valuable insights into the challenges faced by the residents and the factors influencing their decisions to stay or leave. The team acknowledges the need for continued efforts and external support to address the island's socio-economic and environmental issues. By collaborating with local authorities and relevant stakeholders, the team aims to contribute to the island's well-being and week towards ensuring a sustainable future for its inhabitants.

Society does not exist, and cannot be understood, in silos. For critical thinking and creativity to effectively tackle societal issues, the horizons of learning must expand and the boundaries of knowledge must be porous. In an age of polycrisis, when the world is simultaneously in the grips of climate change, economic turmoil, political upheavals and more, only a multidisciplinary approach to education can enlighten minds and embolden measures.

It is precisely this philosophy that animates the School of Social Sciences & Humanities (SSS&H) inaugurated by St Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata on its Park Street campus on August 22. The aim is to "create and foster a holistic academic ecosystem", with the School identifying common areas of interest across the departments of English, political science, sociology, Bengali, mass communication and videography to develop an orientation towards "multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research among students and faculty members".

With an emphasis on application-oriented workshops and seminars, the School will put skill enhancement courses, as outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP), to practise across departments. It will connect students with a network of stakeholders to facilitate internships as well as wider skill development. Research projects will also be conducted as part of the School to incentivise third-party collaborations and hands-on training for students.

Following a blessing ceremony, the inauguration programme for SSS&H got underway at the Fr Depelchin Auditorium at St. Xavier's, with professor Arjun Sengupta essaying the role of the emcee. "This is the beginning of a new chapter of academic excellence at our institution, where this School will serve as a beacon of knowledge for young minds. As a hub of transformation and inspiration, it will help reaffirm our commitment to empathy and the

understanding of the human experience. In an interconnected and interdependent world, this School will provide critical tools for societal analysis that will act as agents of positive change," said Rev Fr Jeyaraj Veluswamy, SJ, rector of St. Xavier's College.

"This school will provide meaningful and practical experience to students and serve as a testament to holistic education and the remarkable power of collaboration. After all, the convergence of disciplines is the bedrock of intellectual exploration, since the most profound insights emerge at the intersection of different fields of knowledge. The vision for this School aligns perfectly with the vision of the NEP to bridge disciplinary divides," said Rev Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, principal of St Xavier's College and director of SSS&H.

Professors from across departments at St Xavier's are part of the administration of SSS&H, with a key role being played by professor Bertram Da Silva, vice-principal of Arts and Science at St Xavier's, under whose supervision the School has materialised into reality.

Short-term, medium-term and long-term goals



Students from the various Arts departments at St Xavier's will automatically become a part of SSS&H

The goals of the School have been segregated into three timelines. As part of the short term, which looks at the rest of 2023, the plan is to organise workshops and seminars for students alongside faculty development programmes. Independent projects will also be taken up, premised on archiving, translation and digitisation, where the concentration will be on research methodology for students so that skill enhancement can be implemented.

The medium-term objectives, for 2024, include designing and offering a three-credit multidisciplinary paper, as suggested in the NEP curriculum besides conceptualising multidisciplinary MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses).

The long-term targets, set for 2025, involve the creation of an interdisciplinary peer-reviewed journal and the development of a one-year specialised master's in social sciences programme.

Encouraging a 'dialectical relationship between humanities and social sciences' and 'transgressive approaches'

After the explanation of the School's modus operandi, a panel discussion took place in the auditorium on "Multidisciplinary Possibilities: Views from the Field", moderated by Dr Shoma Choudhury Lahiri, professor of sociology at St. Xavier's College.

The first speaker for the session, Dipankar Sinha, professor of political science at Calcutta University, harped on how "monochromatic knowledge doesn't give good returns to either humanities or social sciences". Making a distinction between multidisciplinary learning, which he compared to a salad bowl, and interdisciplinary learning, which he made analogous to a pudding. Sinha called for a "dialectical relationship between humanities and social sciences, which had been separated in the 19th century and driven farther apart in the 20th, before coming closer in the hybridity of the 21st."

Partha Pratim Basu, professor of international studies at Jadavpur University, was the second speaker for the session. He underlined how different disciplines can supplement each other by approaching the same issue from various vantage points. As an example, he spoke of his doctoral research on Indian foreign policy and the press. Taking three instances of major foreign policy events across the second half of the 20th century, Basu explained the relationship of the press with the Indian government as shaped by the kaleidoscopic nature of geopolitical conflicts: "During the 1962 Indo-China War, the Indian press was mostly sympathetic to the government until it started making costly strategic errors. During the 1971 clashes with Pakistan, which led to the birth of Bangladesh, the press was by and large in the corner of Indira Gandhi. But during the 1980s, when India was embroiled in an imbroglio in Sri Lanka, the press gradually became much more critical."

A question-answer session wrapped up the programme, as part of which Prothoma Rai Chaudhuri, professor of political science at St Xavier's, asked the panellists whether "multidisciplinarity can subvert or bypass disciplinary foundations by deliberately neglecting structural positions". In response, the speakers reiterated that multidisciplinary learning does not mean the collapse of individual disciplines. Rather, it is about encouraging "transgressive approaches" that can strike the right balance between "the utilitarian and the esoteric" when it comes to the intertwined paradigms of teaching and learning.


"THE VEIN TO VEIN CONNECTION"




v. Orientation on YUVA








2023 marks the year St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, which has always been committed to implementing forward-thinking ventures and striving for excellence in education, became one of the first educational institutions in the country to roll out a new curriculum under the NEP 2020. Since the curriculum also introduces a number of substantial changes, not only in terms of syllabi, but also in credit structure and examination marking scheme, the primary goal in the gradual implementation of the new 4-year B.A. course has been to ensure a smooth transition from the earlier system with minimal discomfort to the freshly enrolled students. In keeping with this goal, on September 2, 2023, a massive orientation programme was organized for first year students from the Arts and Science departments to familiarize them with the new course structure. The programme was held in two successive phases in the Fr Depelchin Auditorium, from 10 am onwards, with the Science students attending the first phase and the Arts students the second. The Vice Principal, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, Professor Bertram da Silva, took the lead in guiding the students through a detailed overview of the new system. The Dean of Arts, Dr. Farhat Bano, who also took the podium to briefly address the students, and the Dean of Science, Dr. Indranath Chaudhuri, were present at the event to answer any and all questions pertaining to the new programme. The event was also attended by Professor Ayan Chandra, Member-Secretary, Academic Council, as well as faculty members from various departments. The new credit structure, and corresponding marking scheme, was discussed in detail, along with a special segment dedicated to outlining the institution's plans, both at the departmental and institutional levels, for helping students navigate the new internship requirement that is part of the unique, forward-thinking outlook espoused by the NEP 2020. In order to ensure that the orientation programme had been successful in communicating to the students the new course structures, each phase of the programme was concluded with a question-answer session, where students were invited to clarify their doubts. The programme was brought to a close by the emcee, Professor Arjun Sengupta of the Department of English, at 12.30 pm, and the students were guided back to their respective classrooms.



Remembering the unsung heroes of freedom struggle

St Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata organised a seminar 'Krantiteertha' to showcase the role of female revolutionaries along with the forgotten heroes.



While Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Surya Sen, Chittaranjan Das, Bagha Jatin among several others will be revered forever and are an integral part of our lives, there are many whose contributions to the freedom struggle have largely gone unnoticed.

Last month, the ministry of culture and the Institute of Social and Cultural Studies in collaboration with the post-graduate and research department of political science, St Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, organised a seminar and extempore competition called *Krantiteertha – Nationalism in Colonial Bengal: Remembering the Unsung Heroes*.

Honouring the legacy of revolutionaries

"Bengal was the epicentre of the freedom struggle and the cradle of nationalism. Bengal stormed into national consciousness riding the crest of the Swadeshi Movement. While mainstream history writing privileges a few as the shapers of history and portrays a handful of personalities as representatives of larger nationalistic aspirations, the contributions and struggles of the unsung heroes must be acknowledged widely. The revolutionary activities of such unsung heroes have emerged as the most extensive legacy of Swadeshi Bengal," said Rev. Dr Dominic Savio, S.J., principal, St. Xavier's College, in his inaugural address.

A similar sentiment was echoed by Dr Jhumpa Mukherjee, head of the department, political science, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata. "Many freedom fighters did not find the rightful place in public memory or historical memoirs. Krantiteertha attempts to capture some of the milestones of anti-colonial nationalism spanning Bengal which was the epicentre of revolutionary nationalism," she said.

The seminar began with the felicitation of speakers. The panel comprised noted academicians such as professor Sanjeev K. Sharma, former V-C, Mahatma Gandhi Central University, general secretary & treasurer, IPSA; Sarmistha Dutta Gupta, independent scholar, writer, and curator; Rajshekhar Basu, professor of history, Calcutta University; and Dr Saumya Dey, professor Rishihood University. The moderator for the session was Dr Arga Banerjee, professor department of English, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata.

Often the revolutionary movement in Bengal is termed as "revolutionary terrorism". For Dr Saumya Dey, the term is not only problematic but also "objectionable". "Terrorism lacks discrimination, aiming solely to terrorise the society. This movement, however, didn't employ indiscriminate violence but focused on targeted assassinations of oppressive colonial officials. I prefer to call it 'armed nationalistic radicalism'. The colonial administration was unaccountable to Indians, leading to paternalistic arbitrariness and brutality, spurring nationalist radicalism." he noted.

Professor Rajshekhar Basu said: "The British officers wrote in their report that the revolutionaries were mostly misguided young men. That they were bereft of any intelligence of their own, perhaps brainwashed. Since they invoked Sri Krishna, Ma Kali, and Maa Durga, the British officials felt that their actions were as 'bizarre as their religion'. The revolutionaries were inspired by the image of Mother India. A Mother India that reassures, provides in plentitude and caters to the demands of the angry and the poor. The revolutionaries often invoked gods and goddesses, especially lord Krishna, because they were influenced by his role as a political philosopher. The revolutionaries felt that if the British rulers were that oppressive, the answer to this oppression lay in reading the Gita which is Lord Krishna's message to any beleaguered soul. The goddesses were respected and revered because they embodied *shakti* (power)."

Elaborating on why several Bengali revolutionaries are not remembered even though they had made significant contributions to the freedom struggle, Basu pointed out that many of them hailed from families that needed to have the cultural or social capital that would put them on the historical map.

Women too played their part

Not just men, women of Bengal were also at the forefront of the freedom struggle despite the idea of a revolutionary being constructed in terms of the culturally accepted idea of masculinity. "While masculinity remained high among the revolutionaries in the early 1920s, femininity certainly came to the fore by the mid-1920s and 1930s, questioning the prevalent patriarchal norms and structures," said Professor Rajshekhar Basu.

Explaining women roles

For Sarmistha Dutta Gupta, the topic of unsung revolutionaries has not only been of academic interest but also of "deep personal interest" since her grandfather's elder brother was a revolutionary who had been executed in the Presidency Jail in

the Alipore bombing case in 1910. Her focus, however, was on the women revolutionaries from Bengal. She pointed out that in the histories of freedom movements that have been written so far concerning Bengal, women's participation has largely been understood as respectable Hindu women's political participation.

"No significant scholarly work in Bengal has challenged the existing knowledge hierarchies and shed new light on women's involvement quite like Suruchi Thapar - Björkert's book Women in the Indian National Movement: Unseen Faces and Unheard Voices, 1930-42. While we have extensively studied the roles of upper-caste women, what's intriguing is the oversight of their substantial physical labour, often dismissed as routine domestic chores when discussing their participation. For example, the countless hours spent by women cooking and nourishing male political activists and fellow fighters are never considered contributions. Additionally, we haven't explored the stereotypes silently shattered by women who managed households singlehandedly while their male counterparts were incarcerated, lost their jobs due to anti-colonial activism, or had their family properties confiscated. Take Pratibha Waddedar, the mother of Pritilata Waddedar, for instance. Not only did she inspire and support her daughter's revolutionary aspirations, but after Pritilata's martyrdom in 1932, when her father and uncle both lost their government jobs, Pratibha Waddedar defied middleclass norms by venturing into employment during the 1930s. She trained as a midwife and visited homes to support her family, raising her younger children and even practising homoeopathy," she remarked.

"Thankfully due to memorials and prison narratives left behind by educated women political workers like Kamala Das Gupta, Bina Das, Kalyani Das Bhattacharya, and a few others, we get to faintly hear the voices of a few women who came from humble backgrounds and suffered enormously in the hands of the police and it has been 76 years since we won our Independence, it is time to get rid of the sanitised versions of history where the nature of the death of small-town women does not remain obscured but gets recognised," she concluded.





Prof. Sanjeev K. Sharma, highlighted the contribution of artists to the freedom struggle. "The purpose of this seminar is to celebrate the fact that every village, town, and city of the country has been a Krantiteertha against the 200 years of colonial rule. Just like we have discussed women revolutionaries who weren't directly involved in the fight but were helping from behind the scenes, it is also important to note the contribution of the artists who were making films, writing books, and poems, and fighting to save the indigenous education systems. The biggest contribution to the freedom struggle has been from Bengal," signed off Sharma.

































Xaverian Debating Festival 2023

A utumn is the song that welcomes Devi Durga. Bengalis are a sensitive people whose emotio-



nal attachment to the gods and goddesses is such that they look upon them as intimately in-

volved in their daily joys, sorrows, struggles, and even in their very destiny.

They are like their parents, elders, relatives, interested and invested in each moment of their lives.

Devi Durga, too, is their very own daughter who comes to visit her parents once a year with her four children. It is her home-coming for the four sweet days—each of themso full of joy, and deep pietistic meaning.

Durga has won her battle against Mahishasura. This is the victory of good over evil, light over darkness.

The celebrations start with the end of Pitripaksha on Mahalaya. On that day, prayers are offered for the peace of our ancestors' souls. The day starts with a radio programme, Mahishasuramardini, where stotras from Sri Sri Chandi are recited and songs sung praising Durga. "Ya Debi sarbabhuteshu..." remind us that the Divine is perceived in motherhood, in shanti, shakti and tripti. The message is that the Divine is to be perceived and experienced with one's body mind and soul.

The four days of puja and the rituals that make up the celebrations are very rich,

Tea Bact

Development of organic tea gardens has become the need for the hour, as indiscriminate use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides have declined the production and quality to a great extent. The research scholars Debapriya Maitra and Bedaprana Roy under the supervision and guidance of Dr.Arup Kumar Mitra, Associate Professor, and Dr. Sudeshna Shyam Choudhury, Assistant Professor, of Department of Microbiology, St.Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata have attempted to breach this gap by creating a novel formulation Tea-Bact: A holistic organic tea solution.

This novel formulation bas been critically designed using a combination of multidimensional bacterial strains like acidophiles, regular compost flora, flora from tea rhizosphere to actively improve the overall soil condition, plant growth rate, and it's quality parameters. After promising results from in vivo pilot studies, the formulation has been recently tested on approximately 650 Dooars Tea

varieties at Ganguly Tea Garden, Rajgang, Jalpaiguri. This testing has been conducted as a part of an industry-academia collaboration between Dr. Arup Kumar Mitra, Dr. Sudeshna Shyam Choudhury, Debapriya Maitra and Bedaprana Roy with Dr. Biswanath Ganguly, owner, Ganguly Tea Gardens.


On the trial two differently aged varieties (10 years old and 30 years old) of tea clones were sprayed with approximately 30 litres of formulation and subsequnt initial trial data has been collected. It is expected that the formulation will accelerate the plant growth rate and overall secondary metabolites during the upcoming flush. It is also expected that the incidence of pathogenic infestation will be considerably reduced while improving the overall soil quality.

It is expected that this collaboration will further enrich the understanding of plantmicrobial interaction on actual field conditions while proving to be a low cost sustainable solution for otherwise sinking tea industry.

Dominic Savio</u>, the Principal of St. Xavier's College, Kolkata, the host Principal on his part, welcomed the delegates highlighting the characteristics of the pedagogy that followed in the teaching and learning process – multiculturalism, rural outreach, mental health of the students and social-religious harmony.

<u>Fr. Joe Arun</u>, the JEHEASA Secretary, besides welcoming the delegates introduced the objectives and the discerning process in the context global scenario – around 45 countries heading for general election and the possible emergence of dictatorial form governing, the impending change of the Presidential change of UNO, the ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine, Israel and Palestine, the never ending conflicts between India and Pakistan and Nepal having no education board to regulate the spread of education in the region.

He made a special mention of the 30 governmental notifications binding the education scenario of the country under the ageism of NEP (New Education Policy 2020), which perpetuates the sectarian policy of depriving the marginalized to reap the full fruits of the educational opportunities. Hence he made a fervent call to embark on a serious discernment process to combat the challenges of NEP, to make visible the characteristics of Jesuit educational legacy by following the guidelines of the DDA, UAP, PAP which enjoins the following: -

- =Renewed mission with greater mission through Discernment, Networking and Collaboration.
- =Making all the Jesuit colleges and Universities and the Student movements (AICUF) to become the agents of social transformation.
- =Giving priority in educating the marginalized youth with the needed assistance.
- =Supporting and networking with the new colleges by sharing personnel and other resources.
- =Zonal level networking and collaboration wherever and whenever is needed including for the progress the Jesuit institutions towards becoming torchbearer of establishing a humane society in the digital and artificial intelligence age.

<u>Fr.Joseph Christe</u>, the Secretary, Jesuit Higher Education, Rome, addressed the delegates on Global Perfectives of Jesuit Higher Education. At the outset, he conveyed to the delegates the greetings of Fr.Autora Sosa, the Superior General of Society of Jesus. He called on the delegates to embark on the mission of: -

- =Making all the Jesuit Higher Education institutions of the SJ, to work together and to respond and to make an impact in the polarized environment.
- =To deliberate sincerely in order to set before us a clear and vision of Jesuit Higher Education in India.
- =To decide and formulate definite direction that we want to follow as a global body.
- =To maintain our Jesuit identity in our institution, in our operation and characteristics.
- =To define a plan to help students especially after the Covid-19 for their educational pursuit and to put an end to the number suicide cases among the student community.
- =To develop a new pedagogy to introduce courses on Ignatian spirituality in our university and colleges.
- =To adopt the modern educational technologies to offer on diploma, degree online-courses in collaboration with various universities.
- =To introduce the modern technology such as Artificial Intelligence in the teaching-learning process by integrating it in the pedagogy.
- =To initiate among the Jesuit institutions collaborative researches in the area democracy etc.
- =To revamp collaboration leading towards solidarity for sharing of personnel, knowledge and financial resources.
- =To make a token contribution to the Assistanchy for the education of the youth from the poorer nations.
- =To integrate the positive aspects of NEP 2020, UAP and PAP in our vision of higher education.
- =To organize an International Conference in Columbia in the month of July, 2025 for greater networking and collaboration among Jesuit Higher education institutions on a global level.
- Fr. Stanislaus D'Souza, President, Jesuit Conference of South Asia (JCSA) emphasized the following points in his address to the delegates of the conference: -
- + The annual conference is the time for fruitful sharing in order to give impetus for mutual deliberation, sharing and collaboration towards fulfilling the mission of the higher education in the Assistancy.
- + Creating the Zonal Divisions of Jesuit Higher education institutions for a better coordination, collaborations and networking is a notable effort by the Secretary JHEASA.
- + Sitting on the legacy of our forefathers, the Jesuit universities and colleges have to reinvent and reimagine our ministries.
- + To be present at this venue of the conference, Calcutta, a land which gave birth to eminent educationist such as Rabindranath Tagore, Aurobinda Ghosh and stateman like Jagadish Subash Chandra Bose is an opportunity for us to imbibe their spirit to set the Jesuit Higher Education on fire.
- =To combat the negative impact of the globalization and to boost our rural education towards achieving global standard.
- + To make the role of the Jesuit higher educational institution at the forefront of global education towards transforming the global society.
- + To explore new opportunity, new ways and means to make Jesuit higher education more meaningful.
- + To set up Jesuit Education Task Force in the Assistancy to reorient, envision, reimagine and redefining our Jesuit Education in order to emerge in order to initiate a "kairo" moment.

JHEASA MAGIS Award Ceremony

- = The JHEASA has introduced the MAGIS award for a Jesuit / person for making outstanding contribution in the area of Jesuit Higher Education. With the due consent of the POSA and Zonal Jesuit Higher Education Coordinators, the first MAGIS Medal with Citation was conferred on Fr. Felix raj, the Vice-Chancellor of St. Xavier's University, and Kolkata for his outstanding contribution spanning over three decades.
- = The due process of receiving nomination and selection will be followed for conferring the award in future.

<u>Fr. Felix raj</u>, in his acceptance speech thanked for the honor in recognition of his service. In his speech on Collaboration and Networking, he outlined the following elements: -

- =The Jesuit institutions have been talking about networking among themselves for quite some TIME now but concrete actions were missing.
- =The first step towards networking and collaboration is discernment process at the individual, group and collective level. Such a model proved very effective in Calcutta.
- = St. Xavier's University is a tremendous success story as the result of the networking among St. Xavier's College, Kolkata, Alumni Associations and the Corporate houses.
- =The Alumni Association initiated networking among the past students of the college settled in diverse parts of the globe. As a result, many St. Xavier's Alumni Chapters were set up to involve them in the expansion projects of the college.
- =The Chapters worked on the vision of 2020 for mustering financial resources for the new hostel buildings one for boys and another one for girls and set up a rural campus of the college in Raghapur to take the higher education to rural areas for the benefit of the rural student community.
- =St.Xavier's College collaborated with St. Xavier's College, Dumka in mentoring to help the college to obtain NAAC accreditation and the Alumni also was involved.
- =The vision 2030 is aimed at developing the infrastructure of the university towards attaining international academic standard.
- =Networking with the government agencies and other institutions to share the vision of UAP, PAP and DAS in the line of NEP which reflects certain characteristics and which have already been in practice in our Jesuit institutions.
- =To focus towards evolving a feasible and viable curriculum and syllabus with the public and private partnership.
- + To work towards an academic system which will enable students to begin their first year of their academic study in Chennai and go on in completing the second and third year in Calcutta and Bombay respectively.
- + To make every Jesuit college in India an autonomous institution and energize our faculty and staff.
- + To network towards attaining sate, national, international and global level recognition of the Jesuit Higher Education Institutions.

Mrs. Summona Gosh, a faculty of the St. Xavier's College, Kolkata, proposed the vote thanks for the inaugural function of the conference.

Second Session

The Second session of the day was held at Xavier Hall after the tea break. Fr. Melyn D'Cuna moderated the keynote address by Dr. Anup Sinha, Retired Professor of Economics, IIM, Kolkata on the topic: Re-imaging the Future of Higher Education."

He outlined the following points: -

- =The Higher Education sector witness a sweeping changes with the introduction of technology such as Digital Technology and Artificial Intelligence in the teaching-learning process.
- =Prior to this change, theosophical institutions aimed at propagating basic and general education which imparted notional knowledge and formation of the student for their human and spiritual growth.
- + The industrial revolution brought achange in the characertists of the education by making a demanded for skilled laborers from the educational institutions inorder to meet the requirements of industry to improve the economy of country and the world.
- =Thus Tension brewed between what is imparted from the schools and colleges and what the industry needed. The public schools, ITI and Engineering, Polytechnic institutions sprang up to meet the industry need in the midst of having no clarity as to what types of skills expected of the growing industry.
- =So even the so called 21st century teachers and educational institutions could not impart the needed skills for industry as well as they lacked the pedagogy to meet the requirements.
- =Hence the need to refine the purpose of the education in the following ways:

=To become aware of the fact the pupil has different ways of learning.

- =To guide the youth in knowing the contemporary world which offers lots of opportunities and challenges.
- =To enable the students to respond to the needs and challenges of the society as a responsible citizen.
- =Need to treat our students as collaborators not as a consumers and a product, to evolve a system of making them skillful which also fulfills the aspiration of their parents.
- =A new pattern of the curriculum is essential to achieve the real of education and the best of the best minds not just bureaucrats should be entrusted with this responsibility.

Revision of the curriculum should be done once 10 years to meet the emerging need of the society.

- =Teaching methodology should incorporate the educational technology such as Internet, YouTube, Wikipedia and artificial intelligence etc., and encourage students to learn from their peers.
- =Teachers should equip themselves to be the fire that ignites the students to invent new things.
- =Make arrangements and adjustments for the students to learn from other sources such projects and groups works etc.,
- =The jiggling of classes with one subject to another, a particular unit of the subject should be completed within one go so as to enable the students with a better comprehension rather than teaching bit of different subjects in a single day.
- =Work towards gaining freedom and autonomy to determine what we need to teach open up our students' mind.

=The Indian higher education should be relived of the tension by bridging the knowledge and skill gap.

=The 21st century educational institutions should offer opportunities for the students' enlightenment to lead of life of synthesizing productive skills and values.

Third Session:

The four Zonal coordinators presented their efforts and implantations of Programmes in the areas of Networking and Collaboration according to decisions made in the previous annual conference. Fr. Pradeep Kerketta moderated the session.

(All the four PowerPoint presentation have been mailed to Fr. Joe Arun).

Fourth Session: Spiritual Conversation (Group Discussion)

=The fourth session was a group discussion based on the spiritual conversation mode on the questions to seek the discernment of the delegates who were divided into eight groups to suggest three areas to collaborate and network among the Jesuit colleges till the next annual conference. Each group had a moderator and a secretary to take down the points.

=After the first round of the deliberation, the points were presented to have a second round of deliberation to suggest three main areas for networking and collaboration.

=The 24 recommendations, 3 from each group that emerged in these celebrations were sent to Fr. Joe Arun who would present them during the next day session.

The second day programme concluded with a visit to the newly established St. Xavier's University in the New Town area of Kolkata metropolitan city where the university officials hosted a fellowship dinner for the delegates.

Third Day: 28th January, Xavier Hall

<u>Grace:</u> That we may have wisdom to reimagine a future for the Mission of Jesuit Higher Education

The third day session began with prayerful meditation led by Fr. Mourlin Fernandez and the session moderated by Fr. Marianus Kujur. Fr. Joe Arun initiated the dynamics of the day: -

= The venue for the next conference was mutually agreed upon by the central zone delegates to host it at Xavier's College, Ranchi. The other zonal delegates will jointly do the needful for the conference.

= Fr. Arun informed the delegate-assembly that he has received all the 24 recommendations of the previous day spiritual conversation and that he would synthesize them to evolve three major areas of networking and cooperation for JHEASA member institutions to work on. The areas will be notified to the delegates in due course of time for their implementation and necessary actions. The action plan for the implementation will be in the line of: -

- = With the vision of making the Jesuit institution a discerning institution on the Ignatian model especially in the milieu of working with non-Christian staff and students.
- = Diving the Assistancy Higher Education Sector in to four zones will give impetus to work together to realize our potentially for a greater service in the changing scenario of our Assistancy.
- = To devise a plan for an effective and the most efficient way to network and collaborate among ourselves and with others.
- = To respond to the norms of the NEP and meet the challenges it poses to the minority institutions.
- = To initiate train Programmes to develop Jesuit leadership based on Ignatian legacy and traditions.
- = Initiating Staff and Student exchange and sharing of resources.
- = Establishment of a national center of JHEASA for a better coordination's of its activities.
- =The initiatives undertaken to make JHEASA more visible and to enable networking are: JHEASA Website, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram and other links.

AICUF Presentation

- Fr. Benjamin, the National Adviser to the ALL India Catholic University Federation shared with the delegates the following information: -
- =AICUF has been brought under the preview of CBCI (Catholic Bishops' Conference of India) and has been recognized as a Catholic International Youth Federation.
- = Revive and start AICUF units and almost every province has AICUF unit in the Assistancy.
- = Fostering spiritual, intellectual and mental growth and instilling critical awareness in the minds of the AICUFers.
- = The State Advisers meet at St. Xavier's University, Kolkata, was held to give new impetus to the AICUF and plan out for its meaning centenary celebration in 2024-25. The next meet is planned at AICUF Ashram, Bhopal.
- = A Leadership training workshop is planned in Bhagalpur focusing on the spirituality, constitutionality and democracy.
- = The Inaugural programme of the Centenary celebration of AICUF in May and grand Finale in 2025 May, Chennai which would go along with making the needed amendments in the AICUF constitution.

Task Force On Democracy

<u>Prof. Newman</u> who attended a meeting in California shared the following points on establishing Task Force on Democracy in South Asia: -

- = All the 73 Jesuit institutions need to have Association of Democracy for enabling our students to make a better participation in the democratic process of our country.
- = In Karnataka, the students prepare a manifesto on Democracy according to their demands.
- = Choose zonal representatives to form a national commission on Democracy.
- = Training of teachers and students on democratic values.
- = Make our own representation when democracy is stifled.
- = Setting up of Task Force that will prepare their own agenda on Democratic principles.

Peace and Reconciliation

- Fr. Binay shared the following points with regard to the initiatives taken for Peace and Reconciliation: -
- = Our concern on peace and reconciliation is the reflection of the overall concern that prevails in our country.
- = Jesuit institutions are called to play a greater role in the area of peace and reconciliation.
- = Two-day workshop for the South Zone staff on Peace and Reconciliation. The other zones also can initiate the processes.
- = Lumina, a journal on Peace and Reconciliation, is sent to all the provinces regularly and it can play role of facilitating such programme.



Jesuit meet focuses on NEP impact on minority instts

Kolkata: The impact of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 on minority institutions is one of the issues that will be discussed at the two-day annual conference of Jesuit Higher Education Association, South Asia (JHEASA) that began on Saturday at St Kawier's College, Kolkata.

JHEASA secretary Father Joe Arun said, "The NEP does not mention minorities. We will debberate on the impact of NEP on minority institutions and discuss how we will prepare ourselves. We will take the opportunities that the NEP has given and restructure and reorganize ourselves. Jesuit's response will be scientific and strategic."

Article 30 of the Constinution which upholds the rights of the inhorities will also figure in the discussion.

Principals, vice-chancellors and directors of colleges, universities and manness schools had come together to discern what is the mext direction in the current political and cultural context when there is polarization on the lines of religion.

The meeting also touched upon apprehensions about 40 countries across

the world going to the polls this year and danger sol many autocrats being elected in democratic elections. Wars between Russia and Ukrahie, and Jarsel and Palestine also figured in the discussions.

St Xavier's College Kolkata principal Fr Dominic Savio highlighted several challenges that higher education institutions face ranging from issues related to NEP repositioning of history, prioritizing of sociopolitical issues and hindrance to phiralism in demoeracy. "Our concern is how to look at them from the Jesuit perspective so that our education system is not affected," Saviosaid.

The meeting focused on collaboration and networking as the key to face challenges and respond to opportunities, St Xavior's University vice-chancellor Fr Felix Raj feels that without networking and collaboration, an institution stands alone and there is no impact.

When you network with other institutions, you become stronger and your impact is larger St Xavier's University is a case study of successful networking. We areatso insisting on collaboration and the NEP also talks about it, both within the country and outside the country," said Fr Felix Raj, adding that the more advantaged institutions should help less advantaged institutions with resources. Fr Felix Raj was given the Mogis Medal for his commitment, dedication and hard work in advancing the mission of Jesuit Higher Education in South Asia.

In a grand display of academic prowess and spirited camaraderie, the Postgraduate and Research department of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata hosted Suffragium-Sansad'24, their annual flagship event, on the 16th and 17th of February. The event, extending beyond traditional competitions, became a culmination of spontaneity, awareness, and exposure revolving around the themes "people, peace, polity" and "remarks, rejoinders, and reforms, "the foundational constants of a flourishing polity.

The departmental flagship commenced with an opening ceremony at the Depelchin Auditorium. Professor Bertram Da Silva, Vice Principal of Arts and Science, lauded the department's efforts on behalf of the Principal, Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ. The department launched the 8th edition of its annual journal, the Politique, which harbors interdisciplinary academic perspectives integral to Political Science with original contributions transcending departmental boundaries, as underlined by its Chief Editors, Satantika Biswas and Allen David Simon, in their address. Dr. Jhumpa Mukherjee, Head of the Department, emphasized the significance of Suffragium and Sansad in her address, describing them as "experiences that blend academic brilliance with societal vigilance".

The two-day extravaganza, begun with Ballot Battalions by Enkon – an event power-packed with energetic political speeches, slogans, and heated exchanges among teams who participated as different political 'parties'. 'Lok National Party' took home the first prize, sweeping the audience off their feet with powerful statements and a rather interesting party 'manifesto'. A unique addition to Suffragium was an online event, Reflections, which helped students unleash the power of lens and highlight a pertinent reality through photographs captured by them. Knowledge Knockout was a political quiz that witnessed the enthusiastic participation of students across all departments. Held in 3 rounds, the event ended on a high note with quick, witty and intelligent answers. An extremely unique event for public policy enthusiasts, Agenda'24 was all about presenting detailed policies on contemporary issues with the idea of a better tomorrow. Day 1 wrapped up with Uncover, an investigative journalism event with interesting narratives prepared by the two contending students on hypothetical cases provided to them, enabling them to hone their journalistic skills.

The second day of Suffragium commenced with the much-anticipated Dramatique—a one-of-a-kind stage play event where every performance enthralled the audience with captivating stories, acting, and direction. Team "Tale of Tableaus" emerged winners in this event with their satirical

political drama, eloquently combining diverse perspectives, human insights, and skillful channelling of creativity in the form of a stage play. The event, Final Bout was graced with the presence of Shri Harikrishna Pai, IPS, who along with an esteemed panel of senior professors, evaluated participating civil service aspirants, in a simulation of the third stage of the Civil Sercives Examination – the personality test, more generally known as the interview round. This mock UPSC stress interview, by Chowman, witnessed students showing their grit and presence of mind and served as a much-solicited guidance opportunity for aspiring civil servants, of the college. The day culminated with the final event, The Academy, where participants found themselves in the shoes of professors and presented a lecture on various topics of academic significance.

Running simultaneously with Suffragium was the annual mock parliament, under the convenorship of Shubhayu Saha and Eshan Bannerji, — Sansad'24, a simulation of the proceedings of the Lok Sabha which evoked the spirit of deliberation and diplomacy among students.

SANSAD 2024, the annual youth symposium following the popular "Model United Nations in Institutions" convention, culminated in two simultaneous proceedings – the Youth Parliament (Lok-Sabha deliberation) and the Press Committee. In the true spirit of parliamentary convention, aimed at cultivating future plenipotentiaries, Sansad served as an impeccable demonstration, pioneering exemplary institutional standards inherent to the propositional-oppositional nexus and the opinionated fourth estate (the Press) in India's democratic polity. This year's agenda was the "Digital Personal Data Protection Bill 2023". Issues pertaining to consent, national security, data protection regulations, accountability, legality, transparency, and other substantive clauses of the right were deliberated upon in an academic simulation with delegates in action.

The portrayal of the Fourth Pillar was a success as well. In line with their respective house policies, press designees produced opinion pieces on the agenda and prepared beat articles on both days of the sitting. Audio-visual takeaways on the Lower House proceedings were produced, followed by a special committee discussion on "the effects of adverse disinformation over ethical journalism in contemporary times" in view of accurate, unbiased, and credible press narratives in accordance with media ethics inveterate to the broader reality of press freedom.

The closing ceremony celebrated the winners of the events and acknowledged the tireless efforts of professors, conveners, and committee members who made the event a success. Dr. Jhumpa Mukherjee, Head of the Department, expressed her gratitude and recognized the dedication of everyone involved in bringing Suffragium and Sansad to life as the observance reached its finale, serving as a testament to the intellectual engagement and vibrant spirit of the Xaverian intelligentsia, nurturing future leaders with critical thinking skills, informed opinions, and a commitment to the democratic values of plurality and intersectionality.

The event saw over 100+ teams participating from 22 UG and 14 PG departments, presenting their innovative startup ideas.
