- 1. Understand the key concepts of political theory, including freedom, equality, justice, and rights, and their significance in governance and society. (Knowledge)
- 2. Analyze and differentiate between negative freedom (freedom from interference) and positive freedom (freedom to achieve one's potential), and assess their implications for individual autonomy and societal well-being. (Comprehension)
- 3. Evaluate the principles of equality of welfare, resources, and capabilities, and their impact on promoting social justice and addressing disparities in opportunities and outcomes. (Analysis)
- 4. Compare and contrast procedural justice (fairness in decision-making processes) and distributive justice (fair distribution of resources and opportunities), and assess their role in ensuring a just and inclusive society. (Analysis)
- 5. Examine the nature and scope of civil, political, socio-economic, and group rights, and their significance in protecting individual liberties and promoting collective welfare. (Analysis)
- 6. Critically analyze the debates surrounding human rights, including universality and cultural relativism, and evaluate the implications of these debates for global governance and international relations. (Evaluation)
