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Dr. Chandrani Biswas is Associate Professor in the Department of English. Prof. Biswas graduated with honours in English from St. Xavier's College, Kolkata. She subsequently obtained her Master degree and M. Phil from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. She did her Ph. D. on the fictional works of Toni Morrison and Buchi Emecheta from Jadavpur University. Her research interests include Postcolonial literature, American literature, African and African American women's writing in English, Modernist fiction and Feminism. Prof. Biswas has been a guest lecturer in the Department of English, University of Calcutta. Dr. Biswas is also guest faculty at St. Xavier's University, Kolkata.

Prof. Biswas has presented papers and delivered lectures as a resource person at innumerable seminars, conferences and workshops on African and African American literatures, American poetry, Romantic and Victorian fiction and Postcolonial Literatures.
